## E A G L E HISTORY

The athletic programs at Arroyo Grande High have been some of the most successful programs in the state of California. From the gym to the track, to the field, to the pool, to the diamond, Arroyo Grande athletics has produced individual and team champions from the league level through state and national champions.

Girls Volleyball was CIF champions twice, once in 1990 and repeat champions in 1991. These same years the school produced the National Player of the year in Carrie Wendell.

Boys Wrestling produced CIF team championships in 1999, 2001 and again in 2019.

Football has produced five CIF championships in seven finals appearances. Championships were won in 1987, 1994, 1997, 1998 and 2011. In 1987, future NFL Quarterback Jamie Martin was named CIF player of the year.

Boys Cross Country has produced one CIF champi-onship in 1988 with National Runner of the year Louis Quintana.

Girls Cross Country has contributed 4 CIF Championships to Arroyo Grande High School. Their fist was in 1984 and was followed by championships in 1985, 1987, and 1990.

Girls Track and Field was CIF Champion in 1985 and boasts state champion Stephanie Brown who went on to compete in the Olympic Games.

Boys Track and Field have won 4 CIF Championships as well as one State Championship in 2001. The CIF Championships were accomplished in 1994, 1995, 2000, and

Girls Water Polo team won their first title in 2008. They added titles in 2009, 2010, and 2014. Their most recent championship was in 2021 where they won the State Regional Championship.

Boys Basketball won the Southern California D3 Regional
Championship in 2020.

Few schools in the state can present a resume of winning that compares with Arroyo Grande High School.

It is the goal of the foundation to continue this level of excellence in all of our athletic programs by providing state of the art facilities for all of our programs.
